

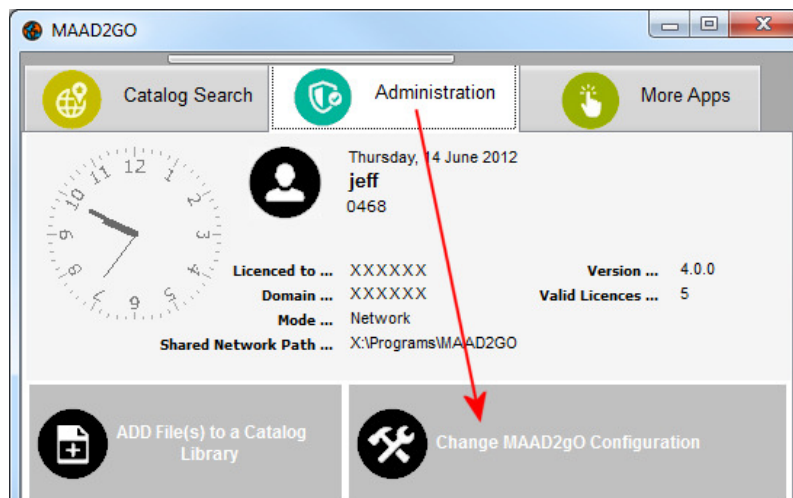
KB3008: How to set the 'Catalog Library Listings' or the 'Spatial Search Map Navigation Options' as the active interface on system start.

This document outlines the process to set the active interface of either the listing for the Catalog Libraries (default) or Spatial Search Map Navigation Options interface on the system start.

This option was added in version 4.0.4.



1. To change, select the **Change MAAD2go Configuration** button from the MAAD2GO Administration tab.



- From the **MAAD2gO Configuration Interface**, select the dropdown selection from **No** to **Yes** for the option **“Display the spatial search map buttons on system start (default catalog library interface)?”**

- Catalog Configurations ...**: Catalog ADDing Configuration ... (No, Yes), Catalog Searching Configuration ... (Yes, Yes).
- Panel Maintenance ...**: Pull-Out Panel Locations - Relative from Main (Right, Right), Mapinfo Configuration ... (MAADgis).
- Buttons**: Update Licence File, Cancel, SAVE Configuration Changes.

Select the **SAVE Configuration Changes** button, and next time MAAD2gO is started, the active interface window would be the same as selecting the button option **“SHOW Map Navigation Panel to set Spatial Search Extents”**.
